## **ABOUT OAK GROVE**

Oak Grove Lutheran School provides a faith-based, Christian education for students from age 3 through grade 12 on two campuses in Fargo, North Dakota. The school, continuously accredited for nearly 100 years, emphasizes a mission focused on academics, faith, and service.

The school started in 1906 as the Oak Grove Lutheran Ladies Seminary on the site of today's North Campus. Boys joined the student body in 1926. More on the school's history is available at www.oakgrovelutheran.com

The high school and middle school, located on the historic North Campus, enroll students in grades 6 - 12. Faculty teach classes in the humanities, arts, social sciences, mathematics, physical sciences, Christian studies, wellness, languages, and business.

## KJOS EARLY LEARNING CENTER

Oak Grove's South Campus has two connected facilities, The Kjos Early Learning Center and the Oak Grove Elementary School building. The South Campus facilities are the ideal environment for educating children from age 3 through grade 5, including 2 playgrounds and 2 full-size gymnasiums.

Entering preschool and pre-kindergarten is an important step in the life of your child. Oak Grove offers an outstanding academic experience with a strong grounding in Christian faith, where students are nurtured and encouraged to reach their full potential.

Oak Grove Kjos Early Learning Center is designed to provide developmental and educational activities specific to your child's individual needs. Our program facilitates each child's learning in all developmental areas including cognitive, social and emotional, physical, language and literacy, and spiritual. As a team, our teachers focus on highly effective instruction and the social-emotional development of your child.

#### PRESCHOOL—Age 3

Must be 3 years old before August 1 and fully potty trained

Our preschool offers children the opportunity to work in small groups with their teacher as well as independently. Small group learning focuses on developing emerging skills in language, literacy, and mathematics. The use of structured learning centers develops children's problem-solving and decision-making skills as well as fosters peer relationships and social-emotional learning.



#### PRE-KINDERGARTEN—Ages 4 and 5

Must be 4 years old before August 1 and fully potty trained

Our pre-kindergarten curriculum includes intentionally planned activities designed for whole-group, small-group and center-based learning. Pre-kindergarten classes offer increased teacher directed lessons emphasizing academic skills and preparation for kindergarten. Field trips and classroom guests enrich and reinforce instruction by providing hands - on, interactive learning and environmental awareness.

## **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**



Children in kindergarten through fifth grade will experience what it means to be part of a thriving school community at Oak Grove Lutheran Elementary School. ## MIDDLE SCHOOL | Grades 6-8



## **FAQS**

Is Oak Grove Lutheran School recognized for excellence? Oak Grove has been named the #1 Private School in North Dakota and the Fargo-Moorhead region since 2018 by Niche.com. The recognition is based on scores including academic achievement on standardized tests year-over-year, post-secondary statistics of our graduates, teacher and student retention rates, and reviews.

Is Oak Grove accredited by the state of North Dakota? Oak Grove has maintained accreditation since 1926, achieving standards of excellence by the State of North Dakota in the domains of Leadership, Learning and Resource Capacity.

What academic programming is offered? Oak Grove Lutheran School serves students from preschool to grade 12 on two campuses in Fargo, North Dakota. Our South Campus, located in south Fargo, serves students age 3 to grade 5. Our North Campus, located in north Fargo along the Red River, serves students in grades 6-12.

How do test scores at Oak Grove compare to other schools? Oak Grove students score 30% higher in the top categories for Math, Science, and ELA when compared to state performances on standardized tests.

Does Oak Grove offer any advanced classes or dual credit opportunities? Dual Credit classes are offered through North Dakota State University, Concordia College, and Valley City State University with over a dozen course options.

**Is bussing available?** Oak Grove provides a shuttle service between campuses before and after school.

What is the dress code for the campuses? Pre-kindergarten through grade 5 wear uniforms. Grades 6 through 12 adhere to a dress code.

#### What is offered for faith development?

Preschool through grade 12 students have chapel weekly. Christian Studies is taught as an academic class. Students can take part in Bible studies, mission trips, and retreat opportunities.

#### What service opportunities are offered?

An important part of the mission of Oak Grove is to develop not only faith but a heart to serve others. Students at Oak Grove partner with non-profit organizations in different capacities in the local community and around the world, starting in prekindergarten and continuing through high school.

#### What kind of tuition aid is offered?


Tuition assistance totaling over \$700,000 is awarded each year to families in kindergarten to grade 12 with nearly one-quarter of the assistance amount awarded in the form of grants and work study. Merit-Based Scholarships are offered to students in grades 6-12 and are awarded annually.

What extracurricular opportunities are offered? Students have more than 25 different sanctioned and club sports to choose from at Oak Grove. In addition to the athletic programs, there are many Fine Arts programs and clubs to choose from. The school's theater program is the only K-12 program in Fargo-Moorhead. The productions engage hundreds of students in four shows each year.

The high school offers choir, which performs multiple concerts throughout the school year. The concert choir completes a spring tour each year. The 6th-12th grade band offers concerts throughout the year, as well. The band tours every other year. The Debate team offers students the chance to develop their effective communication skills. Philanthropy and Youth (PaY) develops the spirit of giving among high school students and offers skill development. Other options include National Honor Society, Student Council, Robotics/STEM club, foreign language options for both campuses, piano, hand chimes and a popular afterschool Board Game Club.


