Oak Grove continues the century old tradition, begun in 1906, of **academic excellence built on a Christian foundation**. We celebrate the unique achievements and opportunities that our students experience during their time as a Grover.

Our mission is to express God's love by nurturing students for **academic achievement, lifelong Christian commitment and loving service** throughout the world.

Named the #1 Private School in North Dakota and the region since 2018 by Niche.com. The recognition is based in part on the state's Department of Public Instruction scores including academic achievement on standardized tests year-over-year, post secondary statistics of our graduates, teacher and student retention rates and reviews.

ACADEMICS:

- **Oak Grove has maintained full accreditation** by NCA-CASI (Cognia) since 1926, achieving standards of excellence by the State of North Dakota in the domains of Leadership, Learning and Resource Capacity. We received the Index of Education Quality (IEQ) of 296 in spring 2022, achieving 100% of all required standards in academic programming. The IEQ is a measure of overall performance based on comprehensive standards and criteria. The IEQ average range is 278.34 - 283.33
- **Students score 30% higher** in the top categories for Math, Science, and ELA when compared to state performances on standardized tests
- **Dual Credit** classes through North Dakota State University, Concordia College, and Valley City State University challenge our students with over a dozen course options

FAITH:

- Vibrant campus ministry that focuses on faith development, service, and missions
- Over 200 opportunities for students to strengthen community and nurture their faith throughout the year with daily chapel at the North Campus and weekly chapel at the South Campus
- Christian Studies classes for preschool - Grade 12
- Retreats, Bible studies, mission trips and ministry nights offer opportunities for students and staff to develop faith together

SERVICE:

- Student leadership and service-based learning through support of organizations such as Operation Christmas Child, Compassion International, Ronald McDonald House, Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, Sanford Children's Hospital, Great Plains Food Bank, Headstart, and Dorothy Day House
- 100% of students at all grade levels participate in service projects

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- 1:1 technology ratio across grades K-12
- Over 50% of students qualify annually for tuition assistance, scholarships, and discounts
 - **Tuition Assistance** totaling over \$700,000 annually with nearly one-quarter of the assistance amount awarded in the form of grants and work study
 - **Merit-Based Scholarships** awarded annually

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

- Fully equipped science lab allows project-based learning with STEM components for all grades
- Significant parent volunteerism develops institutional and community impact
- Celebrates the value of family and intergenerational relationships through Grandparents and Special Friends Day
- Student knowledge is challenged through geography and spelling bees
- Weekly chapel and faith-based experiences in the classroom to support faith formation
- Service-based learning through support of community and global organizations such as Operation Christmas Child, Fill the Dome, Project Ignite Light, Ronald McDonald House, Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, and Sanford Children's Hospital
- Fine Arts opportunities including vocal music concerts, choir and hand chimes, piano lessons and instructor-led art classes
- The only elementary theatre arts program in the metro area with musical productions each year
- Extra-curricular activities and clubs
- Language exploration classes available for foreign language exposure
- Sports teams ranging from camps at Kindergarten age to school sponsored teams by 5th grade

MIDDLE SCHOOL & HIGH SCHOOL

- Block schedule allows time for a deeper dive into curriculum, project-based learning, and more individualized learning experiences
- Dual credit courses allow students to challenge themselves academically and earn college credit
- Student leadership and volunteer service nurtured through local events and global organizations such as Fill the Dome, PaY, Ronald McDonald House, Dorothy Day Pantry, Student Council, and international and domestic mission trips
- High levels of participation are encouraged! A typical student engages in an average of six extra-curricular opportunities
- Strong tradition of fine arts featuring concerts and touring opportunities
- Thriving theatre arts program featuring performance, leadership, and technical opportunities for students in grades 6-12
- Successful athletic teams with multiple state appearances and state titles, as well as numerous individual and team awards at the regional and state levels
- International programming has welcomed students from Afghanistan, Brazil, China, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Italy, Japan, Mongolia, Montenegro, Nigeria, South Sudan, Slovakia, and Vietnam to broaden cultural diversity and worldview
